



Current Review Times



- 44 days for V4.0 (Full C2C: 72, MHC: 33)




ASF Submission Times

(for ASFs submitted from January 1, 2021 – March 13, 2024)




Extensions Trend

C2CPII Actions & Next Steps

- Assessor training and practice assessment, including example ASF (completed in 2023)
- Risk-based ASF review approach (ongoing)
- One on one assessor calls to address problem areas (ongoing)
- Communications to cert holders/applicants (ongoing)
- Development of 'benchmark' Version 4.1 ASF to assist with reviewer consistency and effectiveness (ongoing)
- Digital platform with improved certification process (in development)
- Strengthening review capacity:
 - Training additional reviewers (Q2)
 - Hiring new Certification Associate (Q2)
- Version 4.1 updates to assessor training (Q2-Q3)

Requested Assessor Actions & Next Steps

- Start recertification process sooner so ASFs are submitted well before the expiration date and paid extensions are not needed
- Improve ASF quality
 - Follow instructions and ensure all requested information is included in each ASF
 - Ensure all requirements have been met and QA'ed before submission
 - Address all questions/requests for additional information in response
 - No partially completed ASFs or responses
- Inform clients about:
 - Certification process (C2CPII review of ASF needed prior to cert issuance)
 - Current review timelines (~5 weeks; 44 days for V4.0 and 31 days for V3.1)
- Take Version 4.0 assessor training and practice assessment (Updates for V4.1 available asap)

Email Responses to C2CPII Reviews

- Emails with subject that starts with: "[C2CPII Review] - ##### - ..."
- Please respond directly to these emails without writing new emails or with new subject lines
- This way C2CPII can more efficiently track review-related communications as these are synched to our database
- Email thread is clearly linked to individual certification and increases clarity

Translation of Required Documents

A direct translation of an entire document is highly encouraged, but not necessary, if the following conditions are met:

- It is clearly described in the ASF column “Assessor's Explanation/Comments” where in the documentation the specific evidence can be found that shows that the requirement is met. This is indicated by section numbers, pages, or similar that enable a clear identification of the respective relevant part of the documentation. Please ensure that the reference is as specific as possible, (e.g., in cases where a section spans several pages, not only the section is stated, but also the page number and paragraph.)
- The specific, relevant evidence/language in the document is clearly highlighted (e.g. yellow highlighted text)
- The document is machine-readable, i.e., C2CPII reviewers are able to copy the respective sections and paste them into an online translator.

Please note that C2CPII reserves the right to request documentation to be translated into English when one or more of these conditions is not met or when software-supported translations do not enable C2CPII to review the documentation properly.

Three reasons for adjustment:

- i) certification and recertification fees have not been adjusted for inflation over several years (19% inflation from 2021-23)
- ii) fee for Version 4 needs to take into account the increased time-period (from 2 to 3 years) and
- iii) increased workload for team

The annual fee helps grow the C2C Certified movement and to support the Institute. The revenue-neutral adjustment aims to help smaller companies.



Version 4.1 Development & Launch



An Exception to the Version 3.1 to 4.0/4.1 Transition Policy

For existing certification holders that need to transition to 4.0/4.1 that are relying on components with Material Health Certificates (MHCs) still at Version 3.1:

- Applications for new certificates under Version 3.1 for these products from existing certification holders will be accepted until the end of 2024
- To avoid a similar challenge next year, need component suppliers to recertify to Version 4.0/4.1 as soon as possible

Hybrid Version 4.0 Certifications

- Similar to the policy for Version 3.1 "hybrid" certifications, certification applicants may certify to whole categories of the Version 4.1 requirements as part of overall Version 4.0 certifications to assist in the transition to Version 4.
- C2CPII will accept submissions of Version 4.0 ASFs that include assessments against the Version 4.1 requirements prior to the publication and effect date of Version 4.1 (TBD May/June 2024); however, submissions before the Version 4.1 effective date are not encouraged because the User Guidance and assessment forms and templates will not yet have been updated.
- All requirements within a given category must be assessed against either Version 4.0 or Version 4.1. It is not allowable to certify to a mix of both Version 4.0 and Version 4.1 requirements within a single standard category.

Hybrid Version 4.0 Certifications

- C2CPII will not be able to provide a Version 4.1 ASF before Version 4.1 is in effect. Assessors are required to use the Version 4.0 ASF and explain how a requirement was assessed to Version 4.1 in the Assessor Verification section (column K in the Version 4.0 ASF).
- The following applies for these “hybrid” Version 4.0 certifications that are submitted before the Version 4.1 effective date:
 - Review Version 4.1 requirements will begin only after it has been confirmed by the assessor that the product is in compliance with the final Version 4.1 standard.
 - The assessor must clearly indicate which sections were evaluated against the Version 4.1 standard on the Version 4.0 ASF Admin tab, table 1.4.
 - Certifications that include compliance with Version 4.1 requirements will only be issued on or after the Version 4.1 effective date.

Applications for Version 4.1 Certifications

- Applications and ASFs for overall Version 4.1 certifications will be accepted beginning on the effective date (TBD May/June 2024)
- Applicants who wish to submit an ASF for a Version 4.1 certification before the effective date may submit an ASF following the same requirements noted previously for hybrid Version 4.0 certifications.

Sunset Date for Version 4.0 Certifications

- Applications and ASFs for product certifications to Version 4.0 will be accepted until 31 December 2025.
- Applications and ASFs received after 31 December 2025 will be required to certify to Version 4.1.

"Safer Circular" - the concept

A new C2CC certificate using key parts of the circularity and material health categories of Version 4.1. Designed to be widely accessible and scalable, and an on-ramp to the full certificate. Developed with scaling partners and delivered through Assessors via a new end-to-end digital platform.


